- Portraying a typical subject matter in a unique and creative manner.


Best in Show

Truly a work of art!




First Place

By Timothy Lederach 14 5/8 x 11, Watercolor



Technically stunning!




#21 *Hudson Valley Sunset*By Ruth Crotty
